The above amendment was reviewed at the meeting of the Sub-Committee of the North West Multi-Centre Research Ethics Committee held on 7 December 2004.

#### **Ethical opinion**

The amendment requested approval for two questions to be added to the approved Patient Baseline Questionnaire and one question to be added to the approved Consultant Baseline Questionnaire. The additional questions related to alcohol consumption and PUVA (Psoralens & Ultraviolet A) exposure for psoriatic arthritis (PsA), and were in line with recently published guidelines from The British Society for Rheumatology, which suggested that such data should be collected.

The Sub-Committee had no ethical difficulties with the inclusion of the proposed questions in the two questionnaires.

The members of the Committee present gave a favourable ethical opinion of the amendment on the basis described in the notice of amendment form and supporting documentation.
